Accessing ProQuest

ProQuest databases can be found in the list of databases on the Library website:

Or from the Library homepage: <u>www.uwe.ac.uk/library</u> click on 'Databases A-Z and by subject'.

Browse the list for the database you require from the list above. By clicking on its title in the you will see more information about that database and a link to access it.

You will be prompted to log in using your UWE Bristol username and password. You will now be on the ProQuest website and on the search page of whichever database you selected.

Each database covers a different range of journals, so you may need to use more than one to carry out a thorough search. To select or change database, click on Change databases at the top of the screen.

Searching the databases

To carry out a simple search (default search when BND opens), type in your keyword or phrase and click Search. ProQuest looks for your keyword in the subject, keyword, title and abstract fields.



Advanced searching

For more complex searches, it is best to search for each concept or keyword on a separate line. For larger searcher, extra lines can be added by clicking on [•] Add a row

Exporting search results

You can export references to RefWorks. It is useful to have RefWorks open in another window before you export your results.

Access Refworks: <u>https://www.uwe.ac.uk/study/study-support/study-skills/referencing/referencing-tools/refworks</u>

Alternatively, from the library home page, click on **Databases: A-Z / by subject** and then the letter R, then Refworks.

In ProQuest, mark the references you want to export. They will go into the folder in the top right of the screen:



If you click on the icon you can see your selected items. Click on **Save** and you have the option then to export your references to RefWorks.



You also have the option to save these references to My Research at the same time.

Further help is available from within ProQuest via the Help button in the top right-hand corner of the screen.
