## Description

ESADMM was established in 1752 and moved to its current location in the heart of the green Luminy university Campus in the 1960's. It is ranked among top art schools for the quality and number of student exchanges and welcomes around 50 exchange students every year. Courses are offered in both traditional and digital techniques and students can develop their work in 5,800m<sup>2</sup> of studio space.

## Surrounding Area

Marseille, located on the southern coast of France, is the oldest city in France and its second largest city. It has a huge student population – 450,000 – and was awarded European Capital of Culture in 2013. There is plenty to do here – the city's tourism website boasts of 19 museums, 42 theatres, hundreds of cinemas, 15,000 shops as well as a pleasant, sunny climate.
