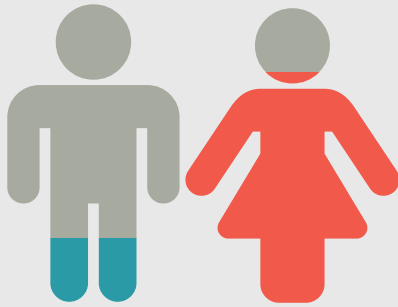


Athena SWAN: PhD Students

Survey of PhD student views in the Department of Applied Sciences, UWE Bristol, May 2016.

Respondents



25% (n=2)

75% (n=6)

All respondents were full-time students.

50% had a male Director of Studies and 50% had a female Director of Studies.

Half of students had supervisory teams that included male and female staff.



20% OF PHD STUDENTS IN THE DEPARTMENT RESPONDED TO THE SURVEY.

7 OUT OF 8 STUDENTS WOULD RECOMMEND THE DEPARTMENT AS A GOOD PLACE TO STUDY.

7 OUT OF 8 STUDENTS AGREE OR STRONGLY AGREE THAT INFORMATION ON THE DEPARTMENT SHOWS THE CONTRIBUTION OF BOTH MEN AND WOMEN.

of students agreed they are kept up-to-date with development and training opportunities in the department and faculty.

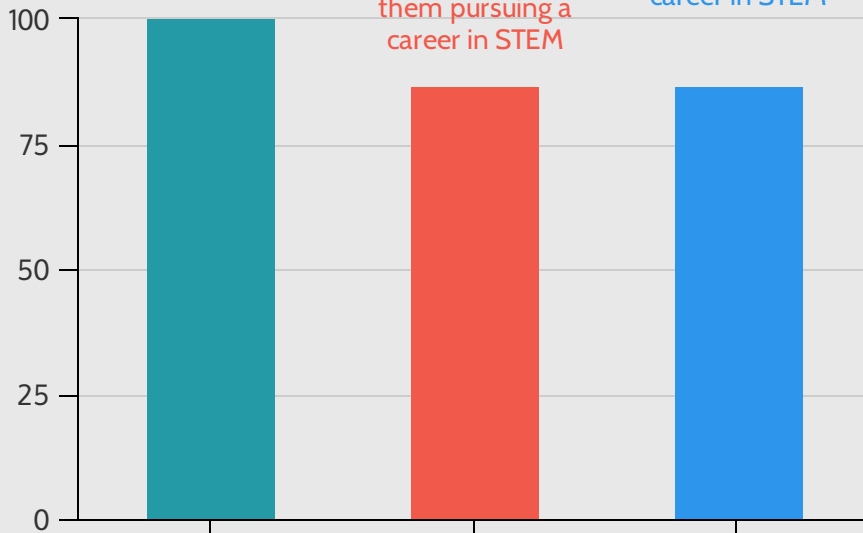


6 out of 8 students agree students are given equal opportunities to represent the department, irrespective of gender.

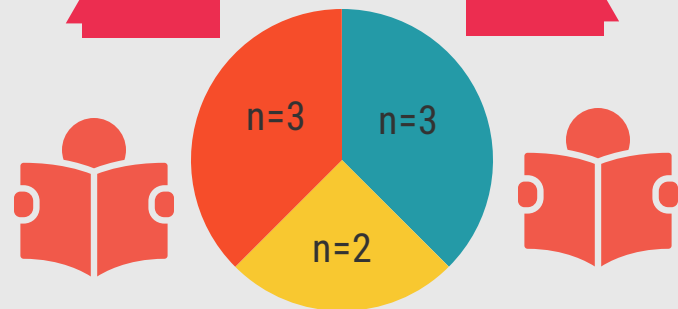
8 out of 8 intend to pursue a career in STEM
