#### Part 2: Description

Overview: This professional practice module aims to enhance and consolidate advanced professional practice and leadership within district nursing. Personal and professional development will be supported via the theory and practice of Action Learning. Masterclass workshops with allow students to advance their knowledge and skills in key areas related to district nursing practice.

**Educational aims:** This module is part of the Specialist Practice District Nursing Programme and has been aligned to the NMC Standards of proficiency for community nursing specialist practice qualifications (SPQ) and Standards for post-registration programmes.

This professional practice module will enhance and consolidate district nursing practice via the use of action learning and masterclass workshops. The aim is to ensure DNSPQ students can identify, and work towards meeting their development needs and successfully achieve the NMC community nursing specialist practice proficiencies and programme learning outcomes. Students will evaluate and synthesise the evidence base to demonstrate critical awareness of the impact of their professional practice on delivery of care and services within diverse contexts.

Outline syllabus: Students will attend regular Action Learning Sets. In addition, a series of masterclass workshops will be provided and typically include:

- Advanced communication skills in end of life care
- Management of complex long-term conditions: principles
- Motivational interviewing
- Mental health crises
- Wellbeing / moral Injury (self and staff)
- Conflict Management within teams

The indicative content of the module will focus on the following platforms related to the NMC Specialist Practice Qualification (District Nursing) standards (2022):

- Being an accountable, autonomous professional and partner in care
- Promoting health and wellbeing and preventing ill health
- Assessing people's abilities and needs and planning care
- Providing and evaluating evidenced based care
- Leading, supporting and managing teams
- Leading improvements in safety and quality of care
- Care co-ordination and system leadership

Part 3: Teaching and Learning Methods

Teaching and learning methods: Action Learning is an innovative approach in developing

and consolidating students' abilities in critical reflection and problem solving. Working with

experienced facilitators and in small groups, students will meet regularly to offer and

receive solution focused support in addressing practice related challenges. The aim is to

promote autonomous, emotionally intelligence leaders within community nursing.

Masterclass workshops: students will benefit from specialist educators / practitioners who

will offer a variety of in-depth workshops to advance professional practice in district

nursing. These workshops will include a range of interactive activities.

Learning and development in practice (consolidation). This is a professional practice module,

during which students undertake a period of consolidated practice with the support of their

practice assessor / supervisor, in preparation for qualification as district nurses.

MO2 Critically reflect on their learning and development over the course of the

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: The summative assessment strategy comprises two tasks - a practice

portfolio and a 2000 word (maximum) written assignment. The assessment tasks are

designed to allow students to critically engage with their professional practice through

exploration of learning opportunities in practice and the associated evidence base.

The portfolio will evidence the achievement of the NMC Standards of proficiency for

community nursing specialist practice qualification (District Nursing) alongside a minimum

of 400 protected learning hours.

Formative assessment: students will have an opportunity to receive peer and academic

feedback on a draft assignment plan.

Formative assessment in practice: mid point review conducted midway through the

programme with Practice Assessor and action plan developed as necessary.
