- We will provide flexible and collaborative learning spaces, pedagogies and technologies that encourage and inspire all our students to achieve their best.
- We will design innovative and inclusive programmes that foster strong cohort identities, and provide opportunities for all our students to be partners in their learning.
- We will design innovative and inclusive assessment for learning, and provide all our students with timely and accessible feedback.
- We will celebrate and embrace the talent and diversity of our students so that all feel valued as part of our vibrant, welcoming, global community.
- We will ensure all our students have opportunities to apply their learning in work-settings and/or environments that are innovative, inclusive, enabling and personalised to the learning needs of the student.
- We will provide opportunities for our students to be internationally mobile and entrepreneurial, and to make a difference to our local community.
- We will support the physical and mental health and wellbeing of our students, with sector leading approaches to support student success.


Practice-led, research informed, inclusive learning and teaching

At UWE Bristol we take a practice-led, research informed, inclusive approach to our programmes and curriculum, which prepares our graduates to be confident problem solvers, responsible global citizens and effective life-long learners. Our students are stretched and challenged to be curious and critical; are empowered to question and apply knowledge; and are enabled to develop their analytical, communication and leadership skills. We challenge our students to be change-makers who can have a positive impact for our economy, society, community and environment; and to be life-long learners able to adapt to changing circumstances with confidence.

Digitally enabled, problem based education

Digital education at UWE Bristol will be a catalyst, enabler and connector, enriching and enhancing problem based learning and the wider student experience. All our students will benefit from a high quality digitally enabled learning and teaching environment which fosters innovation, collaboration and inclusion.

- We will ensure that all students have access to inclusive and dynamic digital and problem based learning opportunities as part of their programmes of study.
- We will develop and deliver a sector leading digital education service to ensure digitally enabled learning and teaching is well supported, agile and transformative.
- We will provide learning environments and spaces that foster collaborative learning and teaching, bringing together learners, educators, professional technical staff and external partners to develop and deliver practice-led, problem-based programmes that prepare them for the real world.
- We will enrich the delivery of our programmes through simulation, virtual labs, studio spaces and specialist facilities.
- We will support our students and staff to be confident and capable, with the skills, knowledge and behaviours that support them to become active and enterprising digital producers and citizens.
- We will have robust and supportive approaches and actions to address digital poverty.
- We will use our innovative learning approaches to build partnerships and networks which will benefit our students, helping them to connect with the world and with each other.

Championing teaching excellence

At UWE Bristol we are committed to fostering, supporting and recognising teaching excellence, creating the best possible learning experiences for all our students.

The teaching and support for learning that we provide is innovative, inspirational and of a consistently high quality.

- Our ways of working will empower programme teams to be creative and agile, drawing in their passion, skills and knowledge to create consistently outstanding learning experiences for our students.
- We will recognise and nurture talent through professional development and career pathways, ensuring that all those who contribute to teaching have the skills, tools and mind-set to be outstanding in their practice.
- We will introduce a new and innovative programme team approach, drawing on expertise from across the University to enable our students and staff to flourish in what they do best through collaboration.
- We will develop our educational leaders to be changemakers, inspiring our staff and students and challenging us to seize opportunities to continually enhance our educational provision.
