Flickr Portfolio Guidance



Flickr is a popular platform for sharing photo-based portfolios. When sharing your portfolio, we need to be able to view this but not edit or amend your work. It is important when sharing your portfolio that you ensure your Flickr content meets the below requirements.

Key things to note:

Each photo you want to display in your portfolio must be set to 'Public view' for us to be able to view your work. This should happen by default, but you can check in your Photostream by checking the 'public view' photos to check this.

Sharing your Flickr portfolio:

When you have created your Flickr album and are ready to share it with us, click the 'share' button on your album as highlighted below:



Once this button is clicked, a URL will be generated and appear as below. You can then copy this link into your UWE welcome website as instructed on <u>this video</u>.

As of 1st May 2022, Flickr has enforced a new limit on **Moderate and Restricted Content** on free accounts. Contents of your account in violation of the limits will be removed, unless you subscribe to Flickr Pro. Free accounts will be limited to posting Safe Content only.
