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A growing demand

The demand for skilled healthcare leaders is rising. Professionals who can navigate complexity, lead change, and improve care delivery are in high demand across health systems worldwide. Graduates of this programme are well-positioned to step into high-responsibility roles that offer career progression, meaningful contribution, and the opportunity to shape the future of healthcare. At UWE Bristol, 90% of graduates are in employment or further study after 15 months, according to the Graduate Outcome Survey 21/22 (published 2024). These are the types of roles you can expect to go into:

Healthcare Operations Manager

Oversees the day-to-day management of healthcare services, ensuring efficient use of resources, compliance with regulations, and high-quality patient care.

Quality Improvement Lead

Implements evidence-based strategies to enhance patient safety, care standards, and service efficiency within health and social care organisations.

Digital Health Transformation Lead

Drives innovation in service delivery through technology, managing projects that implement telehealth, Al tools, and digital health records.

Clinical Services Manager

Leads specific departments or service areas such as outpatient clinics or surgical units, focusing on workforce coordination, service delivery, and continuous improvement.

Integrated Care Programme Manager

Coordinates cross-sector health and social care projects aimed at improving patient pathways, reducing duplication, and promoting holistic care models.

Public Health Services Manager

Leads planning and delivery of population health initiatives, often in collaboration with government or community-based organisations to address health inequalities.

Health Policy Advisor

Develops, analyses, and advises on health policy to influence decision-making at organisational or governmental levels, with a focus on equity, access, and sustainability.

Workforce Development Manager

Designs and delivers strategies for recruiting, training, and retaining health and care staff, addressing sector-wide challenges such as burnout and skills shortages.



The UWE Bristol MSc Healthcare Management and Leadership is a two-year, part-time programme designed to fit seamlessly into your professional life. Through a blend of theoretical discussion and reading, coupled with case studies and real-world application, you'll gain the expertise to navigate the complexities of leading teams in healthcare management.

Core Modules: Building your skills toolkit

Each of the **eight compulsory modules** is 15 credits and is carefully crafted to build upon your existing knowledge and skills, ensuring a logical progression throughout the programme.

Evidencing Work-Based Learning in Healthcare:

In your final year, you'll undertake an independent research project of 60 credits, applying your knowledge and skills to a real-world health management issue. This is your opportunity to demonstrate your expertise and make a meaningful contribution to the field.

CORE MODULES

UWE Bristol

The programme has a total of 180 credits. You take eight core modules; each is worth 15 credits and is eight weeks in duration. The journey culminates with the Evidencing Work-Based Learning in Healthcare project worth 60 credits.



Leading Self and Others

15 Credits

Develop advanced leadership skills through self-reflection and critical assessment of your personal style. This module explores resilience, integrity, and interpersonal communication, helping you grow as a confident, self-aware leader who can motivate and support others effectively in complex healthcare environments.



Managing Inclusive Teams and Organisations

15 Credits

Learn how to lead diverse, high-performing teams and foster inclusive organisational cultures. This module equips you with strategies to address systemic barriers to inclusion, implement effective policies, and reflect critically on your personal growth and professional commitment to equity in healthcare leadership.



Leading Transformation and Change in Complex Health Systems

15 Credits

Explore the challenges of leading change in dynamic healthcare settings. This module combines critical perspectives on leadership, politics, power, and identity to help you design, evaluate, and lead sustainable change initiatives across complex, interdependent systems of care and public health.



Global Perspectives on Healthcare Policy and Practice

15 Credits

Examine international healthcare systems and global health challenges. This module offers insights into accessibility, equity, and cost in policy-making, encouraging you to assess the transferability of global strategies to their own healthcare contexts and enhance leadership through a cross-cultural lens.

Managing Projects and Resources in Health and Social Care

15 Credits

Innovation and Quality Improvement

15 Credits

This module focuses on patient safety, service enhancement, and applying global perspectives to identify and evaluate strategies that improve outcomes and enhance experiences for service users.



Strategic Decision-Making and Stakeholder Engagement

15 Credits

Master strategic decisionmaking and ethical leadership in healthcare. This module equips you with tools to analyse complex challenges, develop strategic plans, and engage diverse stakeholders through evidence-based reasoning, negotiation, and communication, both in UK and international healthcare contexts.



Contemporary Issues and Debates in Health and Social Care

15 Credits

Engage critically with today's most urgent healthcare challenges, from workforce wellbeing to health equity and digital innovation. Through real-world debates and policy analysis, this module strengthens your ability to propose informed, ethical responses to pressing leadership and service dilemmas.



Assessment methods

The MSc Healthcare Management and Leadership (online) programme utilises a variety of assessment techniques to

evaluate your comprehension and practical application of course material. These include:

Self and peer reflections:

Develop greater self-awareness and leadership insight through reflective exercises, peer feedback, and engagement activities that support both personal and professional growth in healthcare settings.

Written work:

Communicate complex healthcare management concepts clearly and effectively through reflective essays, policy analyses, and strategy-oriented written assessments.

Reports and analyses:

Use data, case studies, and evidence-based research to evaluate healthcare challenges, assess organisational performance, and recommend practical solutions for improvement.

Applied Project in Healthcare Leadership:

Complete a substantial final project where you'll integrate and apply the knowledge and skills gained throughout the programme, demonstrating your ability to lead change and deliver impact in real-world healthcare contexts.



Tuition fees

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The fee for this programme is £7,950. You pay £795 per module and £1,590 for the final project.

Fees are paid on a modular basis over the duration of the two-year course. The balance for the current module needs to be paid before being able to register for the next module.

For your convenience, invoices will be issued as near as possible to the start of each module. UK students pay by <u>credit or debit</u> and international students through our official online payment partner, <u>Flywire</u>.

Scholarships and financial aid

UK (home) students may be eligible for UK postgraduate student loan assistance. Students who receive this funding need to complete the course within two years, otherwise payments will be interrupted or stopped.

Entry requirements

To be considered for the MSc Healthcare Management and Leadership (online) programme, you will need an honours degree (minimum 2:2) or equivalent.

If you do not meet the above requirements but have a minimum of 12-months relevant professional experience and/or equivalent qualifications, we recommend that you apply. All applications are reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

English language requirement

If English is not your first language, you'll be required to meet the University's minimum English language requirements, such as the International English Language Test (IELTS) with an overall score of 6.5 with 5.5 in each component.

*The university accepts a large number of UK and International qualifications in place of IELTS. To find details of acceptable tests and the required grades, please visit our <u>English Language Requirements</u> pages.

Exemption from the English language requirement

A Proof of English Language Proficiency (POE) exemption may be offered to you if you meet one of the following criteria:

- Completed at least three years of high school in an English-speaking country
- Completed an International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma in English
- Completed an IB diploma in a different language if they obtained a grade of 5 or higher for one of the English courses
- Completed a higher educational or professional qualification in English
- Working in an English-speaking environment and demonstrably working in English
- Passing a <u>Duolingo test</u>

Tips for a strong application

By following these tips and submitting a well-prepared application, you'll increase your chances of being accepted into the MSc Healthcare Management and Leadership (online) programme.

Personal statement:

In a 300–500 word statement or a 4–5 minute video, you should explain:

- Why you're interested in a career in health and/or social care
- What personal attributes and experience you have which make you suited to healthcare management and leadership
- An overview of your intended career path in healthcare management

Wherever possible, your statement should draw on relevant personal experience. When describing the personal qualities and experiences that equip you for a career in healthcare management, aim to include specific examples that demonstrate those attributes in action.

CV/resume:

If you are applying based on experience, ensure that you complete the employment section of the application form, clearly highlighting responsibilities you've held that are relevant to this programme. Make sure your CV/resume or LinkedIn profile is up to date and effectively showcases your skills and experience.
