### Description

The Free University of Bozen/Bolzano, located at the crossroads between German and Italian economies and cultures, is noted for its high level of internationalisation, and excellent facilities.

It's faculty of Art and Design has exchange partnerships with 20 Universities worldwide.

### Surrounding Area

The capital of Italy's northernmost region of South Tyrol, Bolzano has only been Italian since World War I, and its character remains distinctly Germanic. At the center of the town, Piazza Walther is named for a 13th-century German minstrel. The town's most famous resident, Ötzi the Iceman, dates from about 3300 BC and now rests at the South Tyrol Museum of Archaeology. The striking new building for Museion, the city's modern and contemporary art museum, opened in 2008.

### Accommodation

A limited number of University residential halls are available to exchange students. Private accommodation is also available but the market is small and students are advised to have arrangements in place before they arrive. Expect to pay between EUR350-500 per month.

When successfully selected by UWE and nominated to Bolzano you will need to complete an online application form, print it, sign it and send it to the International Relations Office.
