Description

Memorial University was established as a memorial to the Newfoundlanders who lost their lives during the First and Second World Wars, and is the only University in Newfoundland and Labrador. The University is a multi-campus, multi-disciplinary, public institution striving for national and global impact whilst ensuring access to university for the people of Newfoundland and contributing to the development of the region.

Surrounding Area

St. John's holds claim to being one of the oldest cities in North America. It has a population of about 110,000 people, with a further 100k living in the metro region. With colourful houses, vibrant culture and night life, and meandering walking trails along the cliff-side of the Atlantic Ocean, the campus and community make a

great location for an exchange experience a little off the beaten path.
