The summer exam period runs from **Monday 27 April** to **Friday 22 May**. Please make sure you double check your exam times and locations on <u>myUWE</u>.

We've put together some <u>guidance</u> so you know what to expect, including:

- exam etiquette
- what you can and cannot bring in to an exam
- what you should do with your phone.

The <u>deadline for arranging reasonable</u> <u>adjustments</u> for summer exams has now passed. You can check your adjustments are in place via the 'Personal Details' tab in <u>myUWE</u>. Your exam timetable will only show the standard duration of the exam, but don't worry - your Invigilator will know about your extra time.

If your adjustments are not showing in myUWE or you have any concerns, please contact the Disability Service.

Extenuating circumstances

If you experience something major that affects your ability to submit an exam or submit a piece of coursework, you may be eligible to apply for <u>Extenuating Circumstances</u>.

Resit period

The summer resit period is earlier than last year. This year it will run from **Monday 13 July - Friday 24 July 2015**.

Please note that if you are away or on holiday during this time, and are not able to attend your resit exams or resubmit coursework as a result, this cannot be used as grounds for Extenuating Circumstances.

If you have received all your marks for coursework (component B), and have not passed them with the minimum component pass mark of 35%, then you should get started on the resit coursework as soon as it becomes available on BlackBoard. We advise this even if you have Extenuating Circumstances accepted.
