### Delayed funding and how to manage

#### Free Microsoft Office

As a UWE student, you're entitled to download up to 5 **free** copies of the latest version of Microsoft Office to your own computer/personal devices. To install the software:

- Select 'install and manage software' and follow the setup instructions.

#### Five working day extensions
