## Healthcare during the Christmas holidays

If you're registered with the UWE Health Centre and need to see a doctor during the Christmas holidays, you can make an appointment with the <u>Old School Surgery</u> in Fishponds without having to fill out any more forms (you are registered at both surgeries).

If you need to order a repeat prescription, you should complete the <u>Repeat Prescription</u> Request form and either:

- Drop it into Old School Surgery, and collect your prescription 72 hours later; or
- Send your request and a stamped addressed envelope to Old School Surgery, and they
  will post the prescription out to you.

If you are back at home for Christmas and need to see a doctor, you can register as a **temporary patient** at your local GP's surgery without affecting your registration in Bristol. Search for local services on the NHS website.

## Bower Ashton redevelopment


We're continuing to invest in Bower Ashton, to make sure we offer the best possible learning and teaching environment for our students.
