Extenuating Circumstances for resits

Please be aware that if you decide to go ahead with an assessment, you're making a judgement that you're fit to do so and the mark you achieve in that assessment will stand.

You may apply for [Extenuating Circumstances](#) if something major affects your ability to submit coursework or attend an exam.

Normally you cannot apply for Extenuating Circumstances for assessments you have done – however there are two exceptions where you may submit an application. In these cases if your application is accepted the mark you achieved will be removed.

Please talk to an Information Point for advice as soon as you can (ideally before submitting an application).

Great news for graduate employment rates

Latest figures show that we're leading the way for graduate employability, performing above the UK average.

96% of our graduates are in employment or further study six months after graduating, with 78% in professional roles (compared to a national average of 94% and 71% respectively).

This jumps up to 99% in work or further study 3 and a half years after graduation (compared with a national average of 97% and a Russell Group average of 98%).

It's also good news for those of you currently building up your work experience – more than 90% of graduates who worked with an employer during their degree found professional jobs.
