

No trains to, through or from Temple Meads this Easter

From Friday 30 March to Tuesday 3 April there will be no trains running to, through or from Bristol Temple Meads. This is due to Network Rail completing a major signalling upgrade.

20 stations around Bristol will be affected. Buses will replace trains, but some journeys will take longer than usual.

Remember - UWE Bristol will be closed for Easter from Friday 30 March and will re-open on Wednesday 4 April, when the trains should be back to normal.
