Visit the Welcome Hub in Frenchay Library (09:30 – 16:00) to complete your registration and collect your student ID card. You'll also need to bring your passport, visa and qualifications for checking.

Tier 4

Responsibility for your Tier 4 student visa

As a Tier 4 student there are certain things you need to do to maintain and protect your visa, such as:

- keeping your passport, BRP and documents safe
- checking if you have any work restrictions
- notifying us and the Home Office if you change your address or other personal details
- registering with the Police, if necessary.
