Security and Accommodation staff will be on campus every day, and Wellbeing support will be available online via Kooth Student.

Reminder: IT maintenance and Blackboard upgrade starting this weekend

From **16:30 on Friday 14 December to 08:30 on Monday 17 December** Blackboard and all university IT systems will be unavailable. There will be a loss of service to wired and wireless networks for extended periods.

From **Monday 17 December to Friday 28 December** Blackboard will be read-only but you'll have access to course materials in the usual way. Don't post or add any content during this period unless your tutor has asked you to.

If you have a January deadline, please **do not** submit coursework between Friday 14 December and Saturday 29 December.

From Saturday 29 December onwards Blackboard will be fully available and you can submit assignments as usual.

Exam information and support

Exam essentials

You'll find everything you need to know about exams on our <u>exams webpages</u>, including what to expect, what to bring and what not to bring.

Order a replacement student card

You'll need to display your student card on your desk at every exam. If you've lost yours <u>order</u> a <u>replacement now</u> and collect it from an Information Point.

Check your exam timetable

Double-check your January exam timetable on <u>myUWE</u> and continue to do so regularly in the lead up to your exam. Your timetable is personal to you so don't rely on others, even if you're on the same course. You might be in a different room!

If you're entitled to extra time, your full exam writing time will show on your timetable. Breaks will not show on your timetable, but will be known by your invigilator.

If personal circumstances affect your assessments

If you can't submit coursework or attend an exam due to difficult personal circumstances, there are a number of <u>assessment support options</u> available to you. Please talk to us for advice as soon as possible in advance of your deadline.

If you've missed an exam or a deadline, you may be able to use the <u>missed</u> <u>assessments</u> process.

If you submitted an assessment or attended an exam but you feel you shouldn't have done so, you may be able to use the <u>removal of marks</u> process.

Update on free printing pilot

At the beginning of September, we announced that black and white printing would be free for a trial period until February 2019. This was as a result of a campaign led by your fellow students and The Students' Union.

As long time champions of sustainability, we've been monitoring print usage closely to measure the environmental impact of this decision. Since the introduction of the pilot, printing has doubled.

Please ensure that you are only printing what is absolutely necessary to minimise waste. At the end of the pilot, the University and The Students' Union will decide whether free black and white printing will continue.

Working during the vacation

The Christmas vacation runs from Monday 17 December until Sunday 6 January 2019.

All undergraduate students can work full-time during this period, unless your BRP states that work is prohibited. If this is listed on your BRP please come and talk to us as it could be an error.

If you are studying a postgraduate course the 20 hour per week limit on work continues to apply until you have submitted your final piece of work (typically your dissertation).

Travel advice

If you are planning to travel outside the UK in the Christmas break you could be asked to provide evidence of your studies when you return to the UK. Our <u>arriving in the UK</u> webpage has further information.

Keep your documents safe

Whether you're travelling or staying in Bristol during the holidays please keep your documents safe.

If you lose your BRP or passport it will cause real difficulty in returning to UWE Bristol for the assessment period. If you do lose your documents please follow <u>advice from UKCISA</u>.

Do not use your passport or BRP as proof of age or identity in Bristol. A <u>CitizenCard</u> is accepted as proof of age without risking documents that will be expensive to replace.

Applying for placements

If you are planning to do a placement as part of your studies next academic year please make sure you get approval from our <u>Placements Team</u> and make sure you understand the impact on your visa.

We are delighted to announce the availability of Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) funded studentships at UWE Bristol as part of the South West Doctoral Training Partnership (SWDTP).

We are currently inviting applications to the pathways of Heath and Wellbeing and Sustainable Futures for a start date from September 2019. These fully funded studentships could be '1+3' (MRes and PhD), or '+3' (straight to PhD), as a Master's degree is not a prerequisite for studying at the SWDTP. As well as fees and a monthly maintenance bursary, a range of training programmes are also available based on an assessment of the applicants' prior learning and training needs.
