Working hours

Regardless of the endorsement on your visa, not all students are allowed to work full time during the holidays.

If you're an undergraduate student, you **are able to work more than 20 hours** during the holidays.

If you're a postgraduate taught or postgraduate research student you **must work no more than 20 hours per week** until the successful completion of your course, even during the holidays.
