### Undergraduate students

Working hours during the summer holidays

The student vacation officially runs from Saturday 29 June until Monday 16 September.

If you're an **undergraduate**, you can work full-time during this period unless your BRP states that work is prohibited. If this is listed on your BRP, come and talk to us as it could be an error.

If you're a **postgraduate** student, the 20 hour per week limit on work continues to apply until you have submitted your final piece of work (typically your dissertation).
