

# Update re: capping and removal of marks process

We've updated our <u>Alternative Assessment Regulations pages</u> to reflect two changes coming into effect:

- If your first sit at a module took place on or after 1 August 2019, your resit and any subsequent retakes will now be automatically uncapped (providing you weren't already capped).
- You will no longer need to provide evidence to accompany an exceptional removal of a mark application.
