Changes to our Virtual Private Network (VPN)

From today, our VPN will move to Azure Multi Factor Authentication (MFA), the same one you already use to authenticate other UWE Bristol systems and reset your password.

We have also extended the time limit for VPN connections, so instead of timing out after 2 hours, users will have 7 days before needing to renew.

Please be aware that some software will not be available in AppsAnywhere until you have a VPN connection, so make sure you have set this up first. More information can be found online.


