Have you had your vaccination?

If you are able to do so, you are expected to be double vaccinated against coronavirus before starting your studies. You do not need to have both doses of the vaccine administered at the same venue.

You can <u>book an appointment</u> or drop into a <u>walk in clinic</u>. There are walk-in clinics across the UK, many opening early and closing late.

You won't be excluded from any timetabled academic activities if you're not fully vaccinated, but government guidelines may mean you're excluded from social activities such as nightclubs and large indoor events.



Key updates for international students

On-campus teaching

We're excited that we can provide a return to valuable on-campus teaching. We will also continue to complement your experience with a range of digitally enhanced learning opportunities, allowing you to prepare for, participate in, and practise your learning in a variety of ways.

Face coverings

In line with Government advice, you will still be expected to wear a face mask while on campus, unless you are medically exempt. We will continue to review this.

Vaccinations

All students studying in the UK are entitled to a **free Covid-19 vaccination** (two doses).

There are three ways you can access the vaccine:

- Registering with a doctor
- <u>Booking a vaccination appointment</u> as an unregistered patient through a local doctor (GP) practice
- Attending a walk-in centre (no booking needed).

We even have a walk-in NHS vaccination centre on our Frenchay campus, so getting the vaccine couldn't be easier!

Update to the traffic light system for international travel

Some countries have moved from the red list to the amber list, so check the guidance to see if this affects your travel plans.

Travel quarantine

You must follow the law on international travel. This means that as a student coming to the UK, you must ensure that you check the travel guidance issued from your own country and also from the <u>UK government</u> before you travel (regardless of where from).

If you have travelled from or through a <u>red list country</u> ten days before arrival, you must quarantine in a managed quarantine hotel. You must book this in advance of your travel. If you are travelling from a red list country, you must <u>pre-book your quarantine hotel</u> in advance, or you could face a fine of up to £4,000. You can find out more information on this by viewing the <u>Managed Quarantine FAQ</u> Guide.

If you have travelled from or through an <u>amber list country</u>, you must complete a ten-day period of self-isolation in your own accommodation upon arrival. If you have travelled from or through a green list country you do not have to self-isolate in your accommodation or enter managed quarantine, but you must still ensure you have booked a <u>pre-departure test</u>, completed a <u>passenger locator form</u> and booked a <u>travel test package</u>.

Healthcare, social work and education students

Coronavirus vaccinations and placements

It may become compulsory for students who have professional practice placements in health care, social work or education settings to be double vaccinated against coronavirus before going on placement.

To avoid any delay to starting your placement, please arrange to have both your vaccinations as soon as possible. You don't need to have both doses at the same venue, though they should be at least 8 weeks apart.

You can <u>book an appointment</u> or drop into a <u>walk in clinic</u>. There are walk-in clinics across the UK, many opening early and closing late.

Please let our <u>Placement Team</u> know if you are unable to access a clinic or cannot be vaccinated for health reasons.
