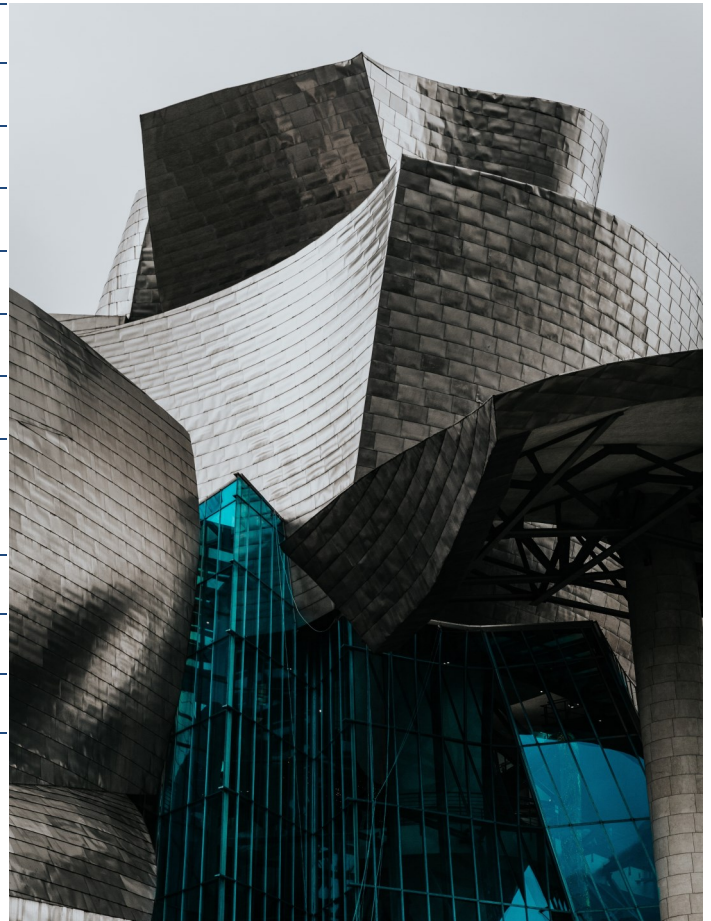

### Description

UPV is the only public university in the Basque country. It has campuses over the three counties of the autonomous region - its Fine Art campus can be found in the bay of Biscay - and a student body of over 45,000.

### Surrounding Area

The Basque region boasts a strong economy, independent government, as well as a distinctive culture and cuisine. Bilbao itself is home to the Bilbao Guggenheim museum (pictured) - a modern architectural landmark that helped revitalise this industrial city. Nearby attractions include world-class surfing in Mundaka, the picturesque seaside metropolis of San Sebastian and medieval coastal villages dotted amongst a dramatic clifftop landscape.
